Quick Guide: Add Notes to Gradebook



Gradebook provides teachers with several Note options. Teachers can enter a "Student Note" for an individual student, an "Assignment Note" for an individual student or all students, and a "Term Note" specific to the course and term. Student and Assignment Notes can be set to Private or Publish. Notes set to Publish will appear on the student's Gradebook Progress Report. Term Notes by default appear on the Progress Report.


Student Note

Recommended: Turn on the display of the StuNotes shortcut icon in Gradebook.


- Go to Settings > Preferences > Student Data Options > Check off "Show Student Notes" > Submit.
- To add a Student Note, click on StuNotes folder for the student
 - Select Private (default) or Publish (appears on Gradebook/Rankbook Progress Report)



o Enter the note and click Add. Note now appears under "Existing Notes".



 To Edit/Delete/Change Status of the Note, click on the Manage Note icon. Submit to save changes.

Assignment Note

• For a specific assignment, go to the specific assignment column > click on the down arrow and select Notes.




• There is an option to enter "General Notes About the Assignment" (Private/Publish), which will go to ALL the students in the class and/or the option to enter a "Notes" for an individual student for the assignment.



Term Note

• Go to Settings > Assignment Weights > Select Course > At bottom of Weights screen click on Term specific folder under Term Note ("Displayed in Gradebook/Rankbook Progress Report") to create the Note.













• Enter the Note - by default this is published to all students (no private settings). Submit to save.



• To Edit the note click on the Date associated with the Note. Check box is also available to Delete the Note. Submit to save changes.



• When a Term Note exists, the Note folder will appear open.
